A total of 60 bowlers took to the lanes to earn a spot into Sunday's Double Elimination Finals. Both the Semis and Finals were bowled on the very challenging Kegel pattern, Highway to... well I won't say where the highway led to, but I will say that it was to a "not so pleasant" place. Semi-Finalists bowled 5 games to earn one of 8 spots in each of the three divisions for the finals. The pattern lived up to its name, as we only had 9 games (out of a possible 300) above the 200 game mark.

The Handicap division was led by Andrei Tacorda with a handicap score of 985. Only 67 pins behind was Colton Moorehead with a score of 918. The remaining qualifiers were Dylan Sager, Emily Cauble, Zach Greim, Noah Tervalon, Angeline Rojo and Jennifer Loredo.

In the Girls Scratch division, Ashley Dunn dominated the field with a score of 972. Not only did she lead her division, but she also had the highest scratch series of all the semi-finalists. A whopping 117 pins behind Ashley was Stephanie Zavala with a score of 855. Following Stephanie were Monique Trujillo, Rebekah Medina, Julia Frias, Christina Fisher, Amaree Durfee and Krysten Martinez.

Last, but not least, the Boys Scratch division was very tight, as only 53 pins separated 1st from 8th and many spots varying less than 10 pins. James Knapp edged out Terrence Robinson for the top spot by 11 pins with a score of 893. A mere 3 pins behind Terrence was Joshua Hawkins followed by Zack Long, Kyle Andrews, Ralph Ramirez, Kennison Andrews and Devon Valdez.

After the smoke cleared and emotions settled, a total of 24 bowlers were told they would have to get some rest and prepare to take on the lanes, and their opponents, bright and early in the morning. Spares and pin count proved to be the key to success, as the difference between 8th and 9th place was only 1 pin in Girls Scratch, 2 pins in Boys Scratch and 10 pins in Handicap. Let that be a reminder...if you don't strike, make sure you get the spare! With the finalists now determined, bowlers (and parents) were encouraged to enjoy the evening in Visalia and return to the bowling center at 8am Sunday...



AUGUST 17, 2014 — DOUBLE ELIMINATION FINALS: The bowlers arrived early Sunday morning and enjoyed a treat (Donuts courtesy of Tom Leigh) before taking to the lanes for their elimination matches. We use a single game, double elimination bracket for the finals, which means each bowler had to lose 2 games to be eliminated from the tournament. Having "mastered" the pattern the day before, everyone appeared anxious to take on their opponents and remain on the Winners side of the bracket for as long as possible. This year's finals was quite exciting as all 3 of our undefeated finalists were challenged to a second match to determine the champions.

In the Handicap division, Emily Cauble breezed through the bracket, winning all three of her matches, which gave her mind and body time to rest up and see who she would meet in the championship match. Her opponent would be Jennifer Loredo. Jennifer had a much longer journey. After losing her first match, she won the next 4 in a row to meet Emily in the finals. With both bowlers receiving 24 pins of handicap, the final match was scratch. In the first game, Jennifer beat Emily 188-154 (including hdcp) which forced an additional game. After moving pairs, both Emily and Jennifer seemed to struggle. The tension was felt both in the crowd and in the match, as the winner would not be determined until the final frame. Jennifer was able to claim the title, defeating Emily 159-157.

The girls scratch division was no walk in the park either. Fourth place qualifier Rebekah Medina was our undefeated competitor. Her opponent in the final match would turn out to be Monique Trujillo, who she had sent to the loser's bracket in the prior round. Monique entered the match with a determined confidence which helped her win the first game 180-160. The bowlers moved a pair to the left and contested game 2. Much like in the handicap division, it was not clear who would win this match. There was no shortage of clutch spares, fortunate strikes and unfortunate open frames, however after a late open frame by Rebekah and a key mark for Monique, it became evident that Monique was going to win the tournament, and she did with a score of 167-146.

Lastly in the Boys Scratch division, James Knapp had no trouble avoiding elimination to remain undefeated. His opponent, Terrence Robinson, had to win 3 straight matches, after losing his second match, to make it to the finals. After game 1, it was beginning to look like being undefeated was a jinx as Terrence handily won 211-135. James would not take defeat laying down, bowling in one of his last tournaments as a youth bowler. He rebounded and defeated Terrence 197-165 to be the only person to remain undefeated all day!


