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

17 adult tournament last year 2017/2018, that was the one

18 we had in Forest Lanes. We made a \$22,000 profit. We

19 will put 15,000 of that towards next year's tournament.

20 The other 500 we will base on what we do this year.

21 Right now we are running a little behind what we

22 anticipate we would be with our adult tournament, 416

23 entries. We budgeted for 450. So we are going to hold

24 back a little bit of that money. If we meet our 450, we

25 will contribute that money for the prize fund for the

4 We have our information in the packet but a

5 couple things I wanted to highlight. In the packet you

6 have the \$1,000 Youth State Scholarship application. We

7 don't feel that we get enough of these back, so please

8 make sure your bowlers get a copy of this form to fill

9 out even if you don't think they qualify. Please make

10 sure you submit it, because, you know, I just don't

11 think we get enough for the entire state of California.

We have a new scholarship award in the name of

13 George and Ola Braun. Ola was a CWBA past president and

14 1978 meritorious recipient, and George participated in

15 150 tournaments. I don't know if you want to create an

16 award in their honor. This is a 1,000 scholarship. The

17 family will receive a winner with our help, but we want

18 to pass that on and hopefully we get some applications

19 for that.

20 Lastly, we have this California Youth State

21 Award application for 300, 299, 298, 11 in a row our 700

22 for girls. Tom would like to give out most of those, so

23 all youths are eligible as long as the scoring or league

24 is certified.

25 So if you have any questions, Tom is the guy

1 LYNN MATSUBARA: So there is a report on the

2 website, but I will highlight we had 120 teams last

3 year. This was at Keystone Lanes, and we awarded over

4 30,000 -- yes, over \$30,000 for only 120 teams. I mean

5 that is huge. So that dollar increase that we got a

6 couple years ago, I mean that is so amazing. So

7 hopefully more of the kids preferably in the north,

8 because we do get a lot of south representation, so

9 hopefully they will see that benefit which I did explain

10 that at Pepsi.

11 I did see a couple of new entrees coming in

12 this year in Orville. So yeah, that is almost - well,

13 linage comes out of that entry fee, but everything else

14 is straight to scholarship. It is a huge allocation, so

15 please push that in your center for state tournaments.

16 We are going to be there three weekends in Orville this

17 year. That's a lot of travel for me.

18 Anyways, yeah. We would like to see that.

19 And since we do give out free entries in the state

20 through Pepsi tournament, we get a lot of new bowlers.

21 And there is a lot of kids. They don't have enough

22 people to make a full team, you know, four, so they tell

23 me, and I put them together, and sometimes we have three

24 or four Pepsi teams, because I am wrangling all these

25 straggling winners together. So it kind of works out

25 Larry went to a seminar, meeting at USBC, and an idea

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1 that came out from another state -

- 2 Do you remember what state that was?
- 3 another state for their youth state
- 4 tournament. They grabbed a lane position and a lane
- 5 number, and they award that person a \$100 scholarship.
- 6 We will try that this year.

7 We have some unassigned scholarship phones. I

- 8 have an app on my phone that will randomly draw numbers,
- 9 so we will do that. We will promote it, and I will get
- 10 it up on the website so the coaches will know. So it is
- 11 not based on your score, it is just your lucky lane and
- 12 number. There is already gambling in Orville, so I am
- 13 sure at least the kids can get something.
- 14 I will move on to Pepsi. And Pepsi we just
- 15 finished this year's event. This is the longest
- 16 tournament, runs from November to May, and I just got
- 17 the money finalized actually earlier this week. So we
- 18 are paying out \$50,000 in scholarships, which is
- 19 awesome, and we have actually eight winners this year
- 20 instead of six because USBC added another division, so
- 21 we have under eight, under 10, under 12, under 15, under
- 22 17 and under 20 divisions. But for the state final we
- 23 only take the under 12 and higher divisions. So we have
- 24 eight winners now instead of six. Those eight people
- 25 technically with birth go into the Junior Gold

- 1 So it is good. It is really good. So I am
 - 2 really proud of these kids, but I want to thank our
 - 3 district's director. We have eight districts, and those
 - 4 districts I know some of the adults may not know, but it
 - 5 is our website. It is broken down by local
 - 6 associations, and Brent handles District 1 which is way
 - 7 up north. So they are kind of by territories and groups
 - 8 within the state.
 - District 2 is Shelby, which is basically
 - 10 Sacramento, and the other I don't know what else is near
 - 11 Sacramento.
