61 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

62 I'd like to welcome everyone to our first zoom meeting Let's hope it all goes  
63 well. I know for some of you this is not new, but to some of us this is new  
64 having to do these meetings over zoom. Hopefully we can get all of our business  
65 done and I'm just happy that we're all finally getting together and I look  
66 forward to seeing everyone next year, when we can finally meet in person. Let's  
67 keep our fingers crossed.

68

69 At this time we need to approve the minutes of our previous meeting, which was  
70 2019. And we need to vote on that, what is your pleasure.

71

72 LYNN GRAVES:

73 Lynn Graves moves to accept the minutes from the previous meeting.

74

75 MIKE LUCAS:

76 Mike Lucas seconds.

77

78 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

79 Okay, it has been moved and seconded that we accept the minutes of our previous  
80 meeting from 2019. Hopefully you've all had a chance to you've had almost two  
81 years to review them and look at them. So is there any discussion on the  
82 minutes? Hearing none will call for the vote.

83

84 LYNN MATSUBARA:

85 The poll is open.

86

87 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

88 If you have the poll is open for the approval of the 2019 annual meeting  
89 minutes. Please select yes or no. Yes, for approval. No, you do not approve.

90

91 LYNN MATSUBARA:

92 Refresh your screen if you don't see the full mine automatically came up so I'm  
93 not sure what to tell you.

94

95 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

96 Is everyone been able to log into Vevox, so that they can vote. You should have  
97 received the information and the link to log into it. Has everyone voted that  
98 wishes to vote?

99

100 LYNN MATSUBARA:

101 It's still going.

102

103 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

104 It's still going? You'll give us a heads up when we have it?

105

106 TOM LEIGH:

107 Rocky says that she can't get in.

108

109 LYNN MATSUBARA:

110 What do you mean you can't get in, you click on the link and then what do you  
111 see? I emailed everybody the link that were credentialed delegates. They were  
112 sent the voting link. I sent it right after I sent the meeting link for  
113 everybody – the Zoom link.

114

115 TOM LEIGH:

116 On Rocky's screen it says that it's waiting to let her in. She needs to refresh  
117 it?

118

119 LYNN MATSUBARA:

120 Yes! Refresh it.

121 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
122 Yes, just refresh it. If it says, "waiting for host", just click on that and it  
123 should take you right in.

124  
125 LYNN MATSUBARA:  
126 Well, 42 people voted and it was 100% yes.

127  
128 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
129 Are we good on the vote?

130  
131 LYNN MATSUBARA:  
132 Well, 43 people voted yes, so I think we can stop this one and maybe the next  
133 one will be better. Let me just show the results I can get it on the page.

134  
135 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
136 It looks like by your actions you have approved the minutes of the 2019  
137 meeting. Okay, we're going to the rules of the meeting. I'm going to ask Lynn  
138 Matsubara to please read them.

139  
140 LYNN MATSUBARA:  
141 Rules of the Council of Delegates to the Officers, Directors and Delegates of  
142 the California USBC Association incorporated assembled virtually on August 1,  
143 2021.

144  
145 We, the Committee on Rules wish to submit the following rules for your  
146 consideration: Robert's Rules of Order newly revised shall govern the procedure  
147 of this meeting, provided they do not conflict with the constitution and bylaws  
148 of the California USBC Association meeting.

149  
150 Using zoom, only one person per computer for voting purposes. When you log into  
151 the meeting will be automatically muted and should remain muted during the  
152 meeting.

153  
154 Delegates wishing to be recognized to speak must request permission in the chat  
155 by typing their full name and the USBC Association they represent. They can  
156 unmute themselves for the discussion only when called upon by the president  
157 discussion shall be limited to three minutes per person on all questions, and  
158 shall be confined strictly to the question delegates and board members shall be  
159 permitted to speak only twice on any question cannot make a second speech on  
160 the same question as long as any member who has not spoken on that question  
161 desires the floor.

162  
163 In order to expedite the business of the annual meeting members shall give full  
164 and courteous attention to the speaker having the floor. Delegates directors  
165 and officers wishing to leave the meeting, must obtain permission from the  
166 Sergeant-at-Arms or his or her assistance via chat. Voting will be run from a  
167 separate website, confirm delegates will have second browser windows open  
168 during the meeting.

169  
170 When three or more names appear on the ballot, the nominee receiving the least  
171 votes on the first ballot shall be dropped. Voting shall continue in the same  
172 procedure followed until a candidate receives the required majority.

173  
174 All cell phones or background noise must be silenced during the meeting. There  
175 will be no campaigning for votes when a candidate seeks election to the CUSBC  
176 board of directors. Additionally, any violation of the CUSBC policy regarding  
177 campaigning for election, may subject the nominee to disqualification as a  
178 candidate. Exceptions may be made to these roles at the discretion of the  
179 chair. Respectfully submitted.

180

181 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

182 Thank you, Lynn. Are there any questions on the rules? Is there any discussion  
183 on the rules and is everyone in favor of the rules of the meeting. And you're  
184 going to put that up Lynn?

185

186 LYNN MATSUBARA:

187 Yeah, it's up now.

188

189 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

190 If you have your voting, the poll is open. If you approve the rules of the  
191 meeting, please signify by saying yes or no. And you may vote.

192

193 LYNN MATSUBARA:

194 43. I think we're done. There's 43.

195

196 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

197 Okay, stop the poll. And it looks like by your action, you have approved the  
198 rules of the meeting. Thank you, Lynn.

199

200 Moving on, all the officer and directors reports will not be read during the  
201 meeting, they are online. I hope that you had a chance to go on and print them  
202 out to read them. If you haven't done so, please do so.

203

204 And all of our committee reports we have a few that we will be discussing, and  
205 that will give oral reports. Other than that, I don't believe anybody has  
206 indicated that they have anything to add to the reports.

207

208 And so we're going to move on to the committee reports. We're going to start  
209 with BVL. I believe we have a video from BVL National from Libbi Fletcher.

210

211 LYNN MATSUBARA:

212 Libbi, did you want to say anything before I start the video?

213

214 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

215 She's here. Hi Libbi.

216

217 LIBBI FLETCHER:

218 Hi Kathy, how are you?

219

220 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

221 I'm good. Nice to hear from you.

222

223 LIBBI FLETCHER:

224 Nice to see your face. I'd really like to thank you all for letting us have a  
225 part in your meeting today. It's been very strange for all of us for the past  
226 year. We are sending ambassadors out wherever we can to speak with some of the  
227 state association meetings. We couldn't get anyone to California since you  
228 weren't meeting anyway, so here I am from Michigan.

229

230 So, first of all I want to thank California because you guys have always been a  
231 great supporter of BVL. We know there's been challenges with you not being able  
232 to be in your centers and to raise funds the way that you normally do, but we  
233 thank you will be watching for you come BVL month in November.

234

235 So, I'm just to let you know I am the consultant for all the USBC associations  
236 on behalf of BVL. And if there's anything I can do for you or any information  
237 that you need from me, please reach out as you'll see in the video all of my  
238 information will be on one of the on the slides. So with that, Lynn, if you  
239 want to go ahead and run the video it's about six minutes long. And I hope that

240 you enjoy it. And we have any questions afterwards, I'd be more than happy to  
241 answer them from you.

242  
243 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
244 Thank you.

245

248 LIBBI FLETCHER:  
249 Thank you again. If anybody has any questions or wants to just shoot me an  
250 email with any ideas or questions, we'd be happy to address those or those of  
251 you that have already sent your checks in, thank you very much for your  
252 donations. And we will keep our books open until the end of August due to  
253 everything we're going through. So thank you again Kathy and Lynn I appreciate  
254 the invitation.

255  
256 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
257 Thank you too Libbi and good luck on your new place.

258  
259 LIBBI FLETCHER:  
260 Thank you very much. And I'm bruised all over the place.

261  
262 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
263 Alright, moving on to finance and budget. Larry Peppers?

264  
265 LARRY PEPPERS:  
266 I think we ought to allow Larry Worrall an opportunity to update his report.

267  
268 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
269 Oh yes, I'm sorry, for BVL, Larry, Larry Worrall.

270  
271 LARRY WORRALL:  
272 Oh, you're going to call on me this time. I'm the invisible person up here. All  
273 right, I'll get my report on the BVL. As you all know, we've got hammered with  
274 California shutting down. We collected the total of \$12,063.64. Orange County's  
275 \$6,000 was left over from last year. When the pandemic shut us down their  
276 payment came in late after we paid their money. So the association put in  
277 another \$6 and change to make it an even \$12,070. So what we did with the  
278 amount of money that we got, along with the request from the VA associations,  
279 we split the money out between all the people that had requested funds. Some of  
280 them requested a lot of money we didn't have it. But whenever we had we just  
281 proportionately gave it to them. All of the money has been turned into  
282 nationals along with the request. And I certainly hope we have a better year  
283 this year. And that pretty much ends the report.

284  
285 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
286 Thank you, Larry.

287  
288 LARRY WORRALL:  
289 Alright and all of the breakdown is on the website too if you want to go look  
290 at it. Thank you very much.

291  
292 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
293 Thanks, Larry. Okay, moving on to the other Larry, Larry's brother, Larry,  
294 finance and budget, Mr. Peppers.

295  
296

297 LARRY PEPPERS:

298 Okay we held no formal meetings during the year. All of the work on budget and  
299 finance committee was done by Kathy Bruegeman, myself and Lynn Matsubara. We  
300 did keep the board apprised of our actions. We applied for and received our  
301 first PPP loan on May 11, 2020.

302  
303 Then we applied for and received a PPP2 loan on March 26, 2021. We have made  
304 application and received our forgiveness on the first PPP loan as of May 4,  
305 2021. From the period of October 16, 2020 until February 1, 2021, we furloughed  
306 our adult tournament director on October 16 and we reduced pay for all  
307 remaining employees on February 1. Then upon receipt up our PPP2 loans, we  
308 returned our employees to regular salaries, including our adult tournament  
309 director on July 1.

310  
311 We did run a senior and state singles tournament and the Diddy Watts youth  
312 championships in fiscal year 2019-20. We refunded all the adult tournament  
313 entry fees for the 2019 tournaments and Lynn did run this summer, a youth  
314 tournament in Southern California.

315  
316 We've only received \$24,000 in Dues as of April 30.

317  
318 I want to thank Kathy Bruegeman, Lynn Matsubara and other committee members and  
319 board members for their assistance during these trying times. Thanks. That's  
320 it.

321  
322 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

323 Thank you, Larry. And I know that you're still on the board, but I can tell you  
324 I'm going to miss you, kind of, as Association manager. Now I just have to  
325 listen to Lynn gripe at me.

326  
327 Are there any questions on the budget and finance for Larry. If so if you have  
328 any questions you can email him. Is that correct?

329  
330 LARRY PEPPERS:  
331 Yes, that's true.

332  
333 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
334 Thank you. Moving on to our championship tournaments, Lynn?

335  
336 LYNN MATSUBARA:  
337 Well, I can speak on the youth tournament. We did run a tournament since  
338 everything opened up in April. We ran a modified version of state tournament so  
339 it was just team event with a virtual singles event. So, using the team scores,  
340 we had singles divisions run with those scores. But, the interesting thing is,  
341 we just did it just so the kids had something to bowl. And because a lot of the  
342 summer leagues weren't certified, we offered just \$5 membership for the kids -  
343 just so that they can bowl the tournament. And we ended up with 70 teams. When  
344 we were in Oroville in 2019, we had 74 teams. So it was kind of interesting. We  
345 had five teams come from Sacramento. The rest were all obviously, you know,  
346 Southern California. Not San Diego, not much from Orange County, mostly  
347 Southern LA County and North LA County. We had a few kids from San Gabriel  
348 Valley. So, yeah, it was interesting. But they had fun and a good time. We are  
349 probably going to award out around \$11,000 in scholarships so, it was pretty  
350 good.

351  
352 I don't have a report on the adult championships. I don't know if Jennie's on,  
353 I don't think she's here.

354  
355

356 LARRY PEPPERS:  
357 She's actually here. She's in my office with me, but didn't run anything in  
358 2019. We simply just refunded all the entries. That's all we did.

359  
360 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
361 So we are planning to host 2022 correct?  
362

363 LARRY PEPPERS:  
364 That is correct.  
365

366 LYNN MATSUBARA:  
367 At Forest Lanes  
368

369 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
370 Yes. Alright, what about Pepsi Youth?  
371

372 LYNN MATSUBARA:  
373 We tried to run it last year, and we couldn't. They even let us modify the  
374 format a little bit because we were kind of getting down to the wire of when  
375 things were going to open up. And when February came, and everything was still  
376 shut down, we had to cancel it. It was so it was disheartening. But, we are  
377 definitely moving on for next year. We have almost all the same hosting  
378 centers. We did have to change two of the local district sites to a different  
379 center, but everything else stayed the same. Everybody was more than happy to  
380 try again to have a have a tournament there. So we're looking forward to it.  
381 That's it for Pepsi.

382  
383 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
384 Alright. Thank you very much. Mike Lucas? Would you like to make the awards  
385 announcements with you and Andre.  
386

387 MIKE LUCAS:  
388 Sure. The only thing I would have is if you look in your group packet, I did  
389 put in the awards committee the information there.  
390

391 Alvin Lou for Superior Performance; Steve Mathews Superior Performance; Frank  
392 Weiler Meritorious Service. 2021 recipients: Lynn Graves for Meritorious  
393 Service; Bette Addington posthumously and Charles Chuck Ellena posthumously for  
394 Meritorious Service.  
395

396 I just would like to thank my committee for their work and also thank you for  
397 honoring me to induct these people into the California Hall of Fame.  
398

399 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
400 Thank you Mike and your committee. You did a great job and we are looking  
401 forward to next year when we can honor all of them. Hopefully, we're keeping  
402 our fingers crossed, that nothing else happens. That we can honor all of our  
403 award recipients at a dinner, at our meeting next year. Andre, do you want to  
404 say anything about the youth?  
405

406 ANDRE EUBANKS:  
407 In 2020, the Star of Tomorrow scholarship went to Leoj Chin and Jennifer Loredo  
408 and the Youth State Scholarship winners was also Leoj chin and John Mehlum; In  
409 2020, the Braheme Family Memorial Scholarship was \$1,000 to David Waybright. We  
410 do want to also congratulate Zach Greim from San Diego. He got the \$1,000 Youth  
411 State Scholarship 2021.  
412  
413

414 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

415 Thank you and again all of our award winners will be recognized next year at  
416 our banquet in Fresno. Thank you, Andre.

417

418 Moving on to our unfinished business. Lynn, do you want to update our  
419 credential report?

420

421 LYNN MATSUBARA:

422 These numbers on the screen are based on registrations. So, based off today, we  
423 have 57 people online. We have four that are guests. So, technically 53 people  
424 could vote. But based on the last two polls, only 43 people voted.

425

426 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

427 Do we have any other unfinished business to look at? I don't believe so. Okay,  
428 I'm going to be calling on Al Hoffmann for the nominating committee report.

429

430 AL HOFFMANN:

431 To the California USBC Association Officers, directors, delegates assembled for  
432 this annual meeting. We, the 2021 California USBC Association nominating  
433 committee reviewed the qualifications and eligibility of each candidate as set  
434 forth in the bylaws. A candidate to be eligible, must reside in the state of  
435 California. The candidates are nominated for a two-year term.

436

437 On August 1, 2021, the following slate is presented for your consideration:

438 First Vice President, Larry Worrall

439 Director #1 Jennie Simpson

440 Director #3 David Waybright, incumbent

441 Director #5 Terri Azvedo, incumbent

442 Director #7 Mike Lucas, incumbent

443 Director #9 Pauline Armstrong, incumbent

444 Director #11 (CYC) Charlotte (Carla) Morales

445 Director #13 (CYC) Linda Stewart, incumbent

446 Director #15 (CYC) Andre Eubanks, incumbent

447

448 And the following persons are put forth as USBC Delegates for 2022 Convention:

449 Kathy Bruegeman and Lynn Matsubara. Kathy, to go back, shall we take First Vice  
450 President Larry Worrall?

451

452 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

453 Yes. Okay, so you've heard the nominating committee's report. Up for election  
454 for the first vice president is Larry Worrall. And we did not have any  
455 nominations from the floor that came in, in the amount of time is that correct.

456

457 AL HOFFMANN:

458 That's correct.

459

460 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

461 Okay. So for the Office of First Vice President, we have Larry Worrall.

462

463 LARRY PEPPERS:

464 I make a motion that we elect Larry Worrall by acclamation.

465

466 STEVE JOHNSON:

467 Steve Johnson second.

468

469 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

470 It has been moved by Larry Peppers and seconded by Steve Johnson that we elect  
471 Larry Worrall first vice president by acclamation. Is there any discussion?

472 Hearing none, I will call for the vote. Lynn, you're putting that up correct?

473

474 LYNN MATSUBARA:

475 That's up now.

476

477 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

478 Okay. So on your Vevox voting app, you will be voting for Larry Worrall to be  
479 elected by acclamation, please vote yes or no.

480

481 LYNN MATSUBARA:

482 I think 44 is our max that we've been getting.

483

484 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

485 There are some that are voting in the chat. That's four so far in the chat that  
486 are saying yes.

487

488 LYNN MATSUBARA:

489 So the four in the chat, you are not able to use the online voting? Because we  
490 don't want a guest that's in the meeting to vote in the chat. That's a problem.

491

492 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

493 Right.

494

495 LYNN MATSUBARA:

496 Okay, so I'm going to stop the online vote.

497

498 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

499 Okay voting has stopped and by your action you have elected, Larry Worrall  
500 First Vice President. Larry do you accept?

501

502 LARRY WORRALL:

503 Yes, I do.

504

505 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

506 Do you have anything to say?

507

508 LARRY WORRALL:

509 Just wanted to say thank you very much for your vote of confidence. Will do the  
510 best we can.

511

512 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

513 Thank you, Larry.

514

515 LARRY WORRALL:

516 Alright.

517

518 AL HOFFMANN:

519 To continue with the slate.

520 Director #1 Jennie Simpson

521 Director #3 David Waybright, incumbent

529 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:

530 Alright, you've heard the nominating committee report for the board of  
531 directors. What is your pleasure?

532

533

534 LARRY PEPPERS:  
535 I move for election by acclamation.  
536  
537 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
538 Okay, Larry Peppers has moved that they be elected by acclamation. Do I hear a  
539 second?  
540  
541 LARRY WORRALL:  
542 Larry Worrall, second.  
543  
544 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
545 And Larry Worrall is second. Alright, is there any discussion? Hearing none,  
546 you will vote to elect the following directors that you can see on your screen  
547 by acclamation. You may vote now. As soon as Lynn gets it up.  
548  
549 LYNN MATSUBARA:  
550 It's up. There's already 36 people that voted. Just waiting for it to go one  
551 more to 44. That's our magic number. Alright, I'm gonna stop it.  
552  
553 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
554 Okay. Alright and it looks like by your actions you have elected those  
555 directors by acclamation. Thank you very much and welcome to the board  
556 everyone.  
557  
558 AL HOFFMANN:  
559 Okay, to continue the following persons that are put forth as delegates for the  
560 2022 USBC Convention: Kathy Bruegeman and Lynn Matsubara. Madam President.  
561  
562 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
563 Alright, you have heard the nominating committee's report for the delegates to  
564 the 2022 USBC Convention.  
565  
566 LARRY PEPPERS:  
567 Larry Peppers. I move that we accept by acclamation.  
568  
569 PAULINE ARMSTRONG:  
570 Pauline Armstrong. I'll second that motion.  
571  
572 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
573 Larry peppers has moved and Pauline Armstrong has seconded that we accept the  
574 delegates to the 2022 convention by acclamation. Any discussion? All those in  
575 favor, please vote yes, if opposed, vote no. Do you have it Lynn?  
576  
577 LYNN MATSUBARA:  
578 Yeah, I'm going to stop it.  
579  
580 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
581 Okay, by your action you have selected Kathy Bruegeman and Lynn Matsubara as  
582 delegates to the 2022 USBC Convention. Thank you very much. Al, would you like  
583 to thank your committee? And, I do thank you very much for all that you have  
584 done over the past few years is our nominating chairman.  
585  
586 AL HOFFMANN:  
587 Thank you. I would like to thank my committee, Don Way and Ernie Suber  
588  
589 PRESIDENT BRUEGMAN:  
590 Thank you Al. Okay, moving on to new business. As you probably heard we do have  
591 a new Association Manager, Lynn Matsubara. And our office has moved down to  
592 Southern California and on your screen that is our new address. Lynn, you've  
593 got some big shoes to fill. I'm sure that you're up to the task. I certainly
