The 18<sup>th</sup> Annual 2023 California USBC Adult Championships was held for 5 weekends at AMF Rocklin Lanes. The staff was exceptional and went above and beyond in supporting our event.

We had a total of 177 open teams (-26 compared to 2022) and 69 women's teams (+8 compared to 2022). The lane conditions were very nice as we had seven 300 games and two 800 series. Everyone received a commemorative tournament patch with a Rocklin "train" theme and a state lapel pin. We also offered first time bowlers a nice souvenir as well as offering the sour apple award and 200 game pins for the ladies.

# **CALIFORNIA YOUTH COMMITTEE (CYC)**

Welcome to our Convention on behalf the California Youth Committee! We have been working hard all year. First, we looked into modifying our Pepsi Districts since our numbers had dropped due to the pandemic and the aging out rule lowered to 18. Then, we put on our thinking caps on to see how we can award our unassigned SMART money since the funds will expire if not used before February 2024. We came up with a new scholarship for our post-graduate past youth bowlers. The deadline to apply is December 2023 and they just needed to be a past youth bowler for at least three years from 2014 to 2022 and have current CA USBC membership to be eligible to apply. We also came up with a team challenge tournament to be run in the south and the north and possibly a mail-o-graphic tournament coming this fall as well.

We have two youth bowlers that applied for our youth scholarships. **Emma Shaner** from Canyon Country won our 2023 Star of Tomorrow \$2,500 Scholarship award and **Stephanie Hong** from Fullerton won our 2023 CA State Youth Scholarship for \$1,000. Because we only had the two recipients, the main board decided that we can double the amounts this year since we need to use those funds by February 2024. Emma Shaner also won the Braheme Family Memorial Scholarship award for \$1,000. That award is funded independently by Mike Hayes, but processed through the CUSBC.

We have two youth events coming up this summer. Our DW Challenge will be held on August 12-13, 2023 at Bowlero Fresno and the Youth State Championships will be held the last two weekends in July at AMF Rocklin Lanes. Many Pepsi bowlers earned berths into those two events, which will help them gain experience and many scholarships opportunities. Youth are also eligible to participate in our CA State Singles and the Cal State Masters this October at Oak Tree Lanes. There is a minimum average requirement, so please read the tournament rules.

THANK YOU again to all of the Youth Program Directors and Coaches in California. We know how much time you dedicate to the youth and that commitment shows tremendously through the great achievements of our California youth bowlers. The CUSBC offers state youth honor awards for 299, 300, 700+ Series (Girls), 750+ and 800+ series awards. We post those awards on our facebook page. Because these awards are lifetime incremental, you can see the progression of improvement in these kids online. It's so great! We look forward to a growing 2023-24 youth bowling season!!

# **CALIFORNIA PEPSI YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The District Finals were held on March 11-12 and March 18-19 at six different centers throughout the state. The State Finals were held at Country Club Lanes in Sacramento on May 6-7. We merged two of the Pepsi Districts this season. District 7 (San Gabriel Valley and South LA) merged with District #5 (North LA, Ventura and Central Coast) and District #8 (San Diego and Orange County) merged with District #6 (Citrus Belt). This really helped with the size of the District Finals since we had lost so many bowlers from the pandemic and the aging out rule.

The first place District Finals finisher earned scholarships and a berth into the DW Challenge Semi-Finals. The U8 & U10 division winners earned a FREE entry into this year's California Youth State Championships to be held this July at AMF Rocklin Lanes. We are proud to provide other award opportunities to the youth through this event as it is the largest youth tournament that we run.

Pepsi Scholarship packets are here at convention for distribution. Please visit our table to see if any packets are from your home center to deliver for us. There are over 150 scholarship winners in this tournament so saving postage will be super helpful.

Next year, the Pepsi Championship dates will be slightly modified because we need to use SMART funds by February 2024 or else we lose that money. This means that everything is shifting earlier. The League level qualifying will return in October 2023, the District Finals will be held for U8 & U10 divisions only on January 20, 2024 and the State Finals for U12 to U18 divisions will be held on January 27-28, 2024.

Tournament packets for the 2024 Pepsi Youth Championships will be emailed to all youth programs in October and of course all information will be posted online at **CALUSBC.com**.
