## CALIFORNIA ADULT STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 20<sup>th</sup> Annual 2024 California USBC Open & Women's Championships being held at Oak Tree Lanes in Diamond Bar is almost complete. Memorial weekend will be the final weekend of the tournament.

This year has been amazing and we have completely sold out. We have a total of 285 entries and so far, one 800 series shot by David Godinez from Greater LA County USBC. Everyone received a commemorative tournament patch showcasing the San Gabriel Mountains and a "Best Bowlers come from California" lapel pin. We also offer first time bowlers a nice souvenir as well.

We offered a Round Robin Sweepers Doubles event this year where you can enter in each squad. You are partnered with each bowler within that squad for doubles. Then every squad's doubles partners are put together into one final result listing to payout 1:10 to the overall winners. We are looking to award \$10,000 in prize money by the time the tournament is complete.

We would like to thank the staff at Oak Tree Lanes for hosting this event and for providing the lane monitors. Hopefully the kids were able to make a little bit of tip money working the tournament each weekend. Also, special thanks to the CUSBC board members that worked this event.

The 2025 Adult Championships will be held at 4<sup>th</sup> Street Bowl in San Jose. We have not been back to San Jose since the mid 80's so we looking forward to visiting this area. The opening weekend will be April 26-27, 2025 and will run for 5 weekends ending on Memorial weekend. Advanced entry forms may be found on our website at CALUSBC.com. We have modified the format to be Team and Singles events only. We will offer the same Round Robin Sweepers Doubles for each squad. Many people are asking why the change. We feel the change will allow for more flexibility and we need to keep up with the ever-changing bowling environment. It's getting harder and harder to get squad times from centers to host for this many weekends. We understand that open play is important to centers. In switching to Team and Singles only, they are both three game sets so we can schedule either event very easily in each squad. Also, some bowlers may want to bowl both events in one day and not have to get a hotel room, which saves on expenses. The event sold out this year for the first time in many, many years, so I suggest that everyone submit an advanced entry form to secure their dates. We will have the \$10,000 added prize money from BowlTV again, which is fantastic! The California USBC also added an additional \$7,000 in prize money as well.

Due to the new mandates from USBC SMART, we had to shift our tournament dates earlier so that we can use our unassigned SMART scholarship funds to this event and not lose them after February 15. Because of this change, we had to modify the normal tournament format and shorten our events. The league level qualifying for the U12, U15 & U18 divisions was held in October. They were qualifying for the Pepsi State Finals held on January 27-28, 2024 at Harley's Valley Bowl in Simi Valley. The younger U8 & U10 bowlers signed up directly for the District Finals, that were held on January 20-21 at 6 different locations across the state: Bowlero Chico, Steve Cook's Fireside Lanes, Delta Bowl, Bowlero Fresno, Bowlium Lanes and Mira Mesa Lanes.

We awarded \$15,000 to the District Finals and \$34,000 to the State Finals for scratch competition. We also awarded \$7,575 for handicap competition. We awarded another \$5,000 for high game awards and \$5,000 for a Pepsi Mystery Doubles event where we took everyone's tournament scores and randomly partnered the bowlers together for even more scholarship dollars! Congratulations to Emalee King from Windsor Lanes for shooting 290/740, Jeremy Morris from Bowlero Bakersfield for shooting 300/834 and Ryan Ng from Classic Bowl for shooting 300.

We had a great turnout this year, but are hoping our numbers will go up even more next year since we can return back to our normal schedule. League level qualifying will be held in November 2024 and January 2025; District Finals in March 2025 and State Finals in May 2025. Locations will be announced soon.

This tournament is more than just a scholarship event. We have bowlers that have qualified to bowl in the Junior Gold Championships this July in Detroit, MI. We also have bowlers that won free entries into the California Youth Championships held this June at Oak Tree lanes. Others have qualified to the DW Challenge held this July at Bowlero Fresno.

Thank you to all of the participants for competing and to the Youth Directors for your dedication in submitting paperwork to this event. It is one of the largest scholarship events we offer in the state. All tournament information is posted online at **CALUSBC.com**.
