CALIFORNIA ADULT STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2025 California USBC Open & Women's Championships was just finalized memorial weekend at 4th Street Bowl in San Jose. We had our best entry count in Northern California since the pandemic. We ended up with 330 entries which was 55 entries better than two years ago when the tournament was held in Rocklin.

We had some great scores. Congratulations to Daniel Chin 804, Nicholas Lew 802 and Paul Tabaka 300. We also had an amazing back-to-back 800s shot by Nathaniel Udy the last weekend of the tournament (264-286-276 = 826 & Singles: 300-280-221 = 801). All of these bowlers along with our 25+ year participation recipients are posted on Facebook. Please share their achievements!

Everyone received a commemorative tournament patch showcasing Monopoly in the Park – a larger than life sized version of the world's most popular board game and the only Guinness Book of World Records attraction in San Jose.

This is our second year in running the tournament with team and singles only. The scheduling of the lanes is so much easier since both events are three games and everyone is finishing in the allotted time window. We also received more walk-in entries since they were able to bowl singles



only and not have to find a doubles partner. We did also continue with the round robin doubles sweepers. Last year we paid out over \$15,000 in the Open and over \$5,000 for the women with this side event. We will have results posted soon for this year's results.

We would like to thank the staff at 4th Street Bowl for hosting this event and to the CUSBC board members that worked this event. I would also like to give special thanks to Tanya Nelson for running the brackets and to Debbie and Tom Elliott for accommodating all of our crazy tournament supplies, and for all of the airport pick ups and drop offs. You were the perfect local contacts we needed for the tournament and I appreciate you handling all of our paperwork and finances. Job well done!

We will be finalizing the tournament, prize money and will be posting them soon on our website at CALUSBC.com. We will have the \$10,000 added prize money from BowlTV again and the CUSBC will also be adding an additional \$7,000 in prize money as well. We will have two DQs. Hopefully they will not delay our prize payout.

The 2025 California Pepsi Youth Bowling Championships has recently ended and we are looking to award \$50,000 in scholarships.

We were able to go back to our normal schedule this year with the District Finals held in March and the State Finals held in early May. Our participation counts were down again, but we are still looking at awarding great scholarships in both handicap and scratch results.

Because our numbers were lower this year, we are going to modify the event for 2026 and go straight to state. This means that local league level qualifying will be held in November and the State Finals for all divisions will be held in March. The timing is good for this change because USBC is also making new changes...

Beginning with the 2025-2026 season, the tournament previously known as the Pepsi Youth Championships will be rebranded as the USBC Youth Scratch Championships presented by SMART.

This rebranding represents more than just a name change; it reflects a new increase in scholarship funding at the grassroots level driven by SMART. The foundational structure of the event remains unchanged, continuing to connect youth bowlers through league-level qualifying into regional or state-level competition with age and gender-based state champions being awarded an entry to the Junior Gold Championships.



Key Changes and Updates (Effective 2025-2026 Season):

- New Name, Same Mission: USBC Youth Scratch Championships presented by SMART. A fresh identity for a long-standing grassroots event
- **Double the Scholarships:** Through the SMART Program, the scholarships provided to the states has increased annual scholarship funding from \$150,000 to \$300,000.
- Age-Based Divisions Aligned with Junior Gold: Following the changes with Junior Gold, the Youth Scratch Championships event will shift to U12, U14, U16 and U18 divisions. The U8 and U10 divisions will still be offered, but only as part of the Youth Scratch Championships.

Thank you to all of the participants for competing and to the Youth Directors for your dedication in submitting paperwork to this event. It is one of the largest scholarship events we offer in the state. The 2025 Pepsi Scholarships will be posted by June 5 at **CALUSBC.com**.

The CYC has been busy this year. We just finalized the CA Pepsi State Finals, which was held at AMF Rocklin Lanes. During the same weekend, we ran our Cal State Youth Queens & Masters/Prince & Princess event. The QM/PP event used to be held on Saturday nights during the California Youth Championships. Because the event was held during the Youth Championships, our participation numbers were limited to only bowlers from that event. We wanted to separate the tournament out so that we could allow more bowlers to enter. We ended up holding the tournament at a different location in Sacramento so that bowlers from the Pepsi State Finals can easily bowl this event at a different squad time. We wanted to make things convenient for the bowlers and parents and it was quite a success. We had 80 youth bowlers participate and will be awarding \$7,600 in scholarships. We also had our Youth Committee run this event. Thank you to Arden Han-Wei, our 2024 Youth Scholarship recipient for working this event and processing all of the online entries into tournamentbowl.com. Also, congratulations to Jonas Makovsky for shooting 300!

Our California Youth Championships are coming up soon. It will be held on June 21–22 next door at 4th Street Bowl. We are almost completely sold out for the first squad on Saturday. If you know of anyone that is planning on entering, I would suggest that they enter earlier than later. Youth are also eligible to participate in the Cal State Masters (Bowlero Moreno Valley) and Cal State Queens (Bowlero Fullerton) this August and in the CA State Singles (Mira Mesa Lanes) in October. There are some minimum average requirements, so please be sure to read the tournament rules. Entries can be downloaded at CALUSBC.com.

We know how much time you dedicate to the youth and we see the achievements that they are reaching through our state youth honor awards program that awards 11-in-a-row, 299, 300, 700+ Series (Girls), 750+ and 800+ series awards.
